

# **Student Statistics Report 2021**

#### SNAPSHOT OF FINDINGS

#### **Australia**

At the end of **2020**, 3,656 medical students **graduated** from Australian medical schools, 19 more than the previous year. Of these, 83.9% (3,066) were domestic students. The number of international graduates rose by 11.3% on the previous year, to 590. Female graduates comprise 52.8% of the cohort.

In 2021, 4,153 students **commenced** studying medicine at an Australian medical school, 96 more than in 2020. Commencements in 2022 are projected to be 4,065 students.

There were 3,533 domestic commencements in 2021 which was 122 more than in 2020. Of these, 10.4% were full fee paying, a decrease from 11.1% in 2020. The proportion of international commencing students in 2021 decreased slightly to 14.9% (from 15.9% in 2020).

In total there were 3,165 Commonwealth Supported Places (CSPs) commencing this year, 134 more than in 2020. There were 7 more bonded places (to work in areas of workforce shortage) and 139 more non-bonded places. Domestic medical students in a bonded scheme made up 26.7% of the total domestic commencements.

Overall, females comprised 54.3% of commencing medical students, higher than the 51.0% in 2020. This gender balance pattern was very similar for international student commencements with 55.2% female versus 44.8% male, and for the bonded (51.5% female) and non-bonded CSP cohorts (54.5% female).

There were 3,807 students enrolled **in their final year** of medical school in 2021. Applying a final-year attrition rate similar to that seen in recent years (2.9%) it is anticipated that around 3,697 will graduate at the end of 2021.

#### **New Zealand**

In 2019, New Zealand medical schools **graduated** 561 doctors, 36 more than in 2019, of which 536 were domestic students. 58.3% of all graduates were female.

This year 594 medical students **commenced** study at New Zealand medical schools, 17 more than in 2020. 39 are international students, 4 more than in 2020. Commencing numbers have been relatively stable for the last 5 years and are expected to remain so, with 590 students projected to commence in 2022.

In New Zealand in 2021, 56.2% of commencing medical students were female, a slight decrease from the 58.9% of 2020. For domestic commencements the proportion of females was 56% in 2021, down from 59.4% in 2020.

A total of 579 medical students are **in their final year**. Based on the average of the last 4 years' final-year attrition rates (1.6%) at New Zealand medical schools, 570 are anticipated to graduate in 2021.

<u>Note</u>: Similarly, no adjustments have been made to the above figures on projected 2022 commencements or 2021 graduates to take account of any impact of the COVID-19 pandemic.

## Indigenous students and graduates

In 2020, 65 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander doctors **graduated** from medical programs in Australia, and in New Zealand 78 Māori doctors graduated. Across Australia and New Zealand there has been a 62.5% increase in the number of Indigenous graduates since 2015.

In Australia this year, 112 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students **commenced** studying medicine, which is 3.2% of domestic commencing students.

In New Zealand 100 commencing medical students were Māori, comprising 18.0% of the commencing domestic cohort – slightly lower than the 20.7% proportion seen in 2020.

A total of 412 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students are **enrolled** in an Australian medical school in 2021; 2.7% of domestic enrolments. There has been consistent growth in these figures, from 286 enrolments in 2016 when the proportion was 1.97% of domestic enrolments.

In New Zealand, 491 Māori students are enrolled, comprising 18.0% of domestic students. This has increased from the 357 Māori students and 14.0% of New Zealand domestic enrolments in 2016.

<u>Note:</u> No adjustments have been made to the above figures on projected 2022 commencements or 2021 graduates to take account of any impact of the COVID-19 pandemic.

This Report has been updated since its original release to include the additional 34 students who commenced in Bond Medical School's September intake.

## **Australian Medical School Graduates in 2020**

A total of 3,656 medical students graduated from Australian medical schools in 2020, of which 3,066 (83.9%) were domestic and 590 (16.1%) international students. In 2020, the largest cohort (31.7%) graduated from NSW/ACT medical schools, followed by Victoria (24.8%) and Queensland (22.7%).

The number of future graduates cannot be accurately estimated as it depends on the rate of attrition for each year, which can vary widely. We have therefore calculated estimates for future years by applying a *single* reduction of 2.9% to the number of students currently enrolled in the years that will be graduating 2021 to 2024; 2.9% being the average of the last four years' final-year attrition rate of all Australian medical schools. *Note: no attrition for the years leading up to the final year has been applied.*

Following the slowed growth in commencing students, the numbers of graduating students has started to plateau and is expected to remain fairly stable in the coming years.




Figure 1. Australian medical school graduates - by year (projected for 2021 onwards)




Figure 2. All Australian medical school graduates – by gender

#### **New Zealand Medical School Graduates in 2020**

A total of 561 medical students graduated from New Zealand medical schools in 2020.



The number of future graduates depends on the attrition rate for each year, which can vary widely. We have therefore estimated future graduate number by applying a *single* reduction of 1.6% to the number of students currently enrolled in the years that will be graduating 2021 to 2024; 1.6% being the average of the New Zealand schools' final year attrition rate over the last four years. *Note:* as for Australian estimates, no attrition for the years leading up to the final year has been applied.




Figure 4. All New Zealand medical school graduates – by gender

# **Indigenous Graduates in 2020**

In 2020, 65 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students graduated from medical programs in Australia, and 78 Māori students graduated from New Zealand schools.

Figure 5. Graduating Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students from Australian medical schools





Figure 6. Graduating Māori students from New Zealand medical schools



#### **Australian Medical School Commencements**

In 2021 there were 4,153 commencing medical students in Australia, a 2.4% increase on 2020 numbers (Table 4). Commencements comprised 3,533 domestic and 620 international students. Projections are for 4,065 students to commence in 2022.

#### Gender

Female students accounted for 54.3% of commencing students in Australian medical schools in 2021, an increase on 2020 when the gender ratio was more balanced at 51.0% female. More female than male students occurred for all entry schemes except for the Northern Territory Medical Program (NTMP) where females comprised 44.0%. For the other entry schemes the female gender proportion was: non-bonded CSPs 54.4%; bonded CSPs 51.5%; domestic full fee paying (excluding NTMP) 60.1%; international full fee-paying: 55.2%.

<u>Note</u>: a small number of students at Australian medical schools identified as non-binary, intersex or unspecified. Due to the low numbers involved, these have been omitted from tables and figures reporting counts by gender.




Figure 8. All commencements at Australian medical schools - by gender




Figure 9. Australian medical school commencements - by gender and entry scheme in 2021

In Australia, the total number of commencing Commonwealth Supported Places (CSPs) increased by 134 to 3,165. The proportion of commencing domestic students in the Commonwealth's Bonded Medical Places (BMP) scheme – in which the participant accepts a CSP and agrees to work in an area of workforce shortage for a period of time – remained steady (26.7% in 2021 versus 27.0% in 2020).




Figure 10. Australian medical school commencements – by Commonwealth Supported Places (CSPs)

#### **Full Fee Paying students**

Across medical schools in Australia in 2021, 10.4% of domestic commencing students were full fee paying (FFP) – down from the 11.1% observed in 2020.

The proportion of commencing international students compared to total commencing students decreased slightly (14.9% in 2021 versus 15.9% in 2020).




Figure 11. Australian medical school commencements - by full fee paying (FFP) places

The entry path numbers of Australian medical school commencements has remained fairly stable over the last few years


#### **New Zealand Medical School Commencements**

In New Zealand there were 555 domestic and 39 international commencing medical students in 2021. After a gradual increase of total commencements from 2010 to 2015, numbers have plateaued. It is projected that 590 students will commence medical studies in New Zealand in 2022.

#### Gender

In 2021, the proportion of female commencements at New Zealand medical schools dropped slightly from 58.9% in 2020 to 56.2% in 2021. The proportion of female commencements has remained above 56% since 2016.




Figure 13. All commencements across New Zealand medical schools – by gender

## **Indigenous commencements**

In 2021, 112 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students started in year one of medicine, which is 3.2% of domestic commencing medical students in Australia. While this represents a 7.4% decrease from 2020, numbers have increased 34.9% since 2016.




Figure 14. Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander student commencements at Australian medical schools

In New Zealand there were 100 commencing Māori medical students in 2021, comprising 18.0% of the domestic cohort.




Figure 15. Māori student commencements at New Zealand medical schools


## **Australian Medical School Total Enrolments**

Enrolments at Australia medical schools in 2021 have increased 6.8% in the last 8 years




Figure 17. Students enrolled in Australian medical schools - by year of course in 2021

#### Gender

Of all students enrolled in a medical program in Australia, the gender balance marginally increased to 52.9%, and has continued to remain above 52.0% since 2017.




Figure 18. All enrolments at Australian medical schools – by gender


### **New Zealand Medical Schools Total Enrolments**

In New Zealand medical schools in 2021 there were 2,876 total enrolments, comprising 2,724 domestic and 152 international students (94.7% and 5.3% of enrolments respectively).

New Zealand enrolments are plateauing after a period of growth




Figure 20. New Zealand medical school enrolments – by year of course in 2021




Figure 21. All enrolments at New Zealand medical schools - by gender


# **Indigenous Total Enrolments**

#### **BACKGROUND**

Medical Deans Australia and New Zealand (Medical Deans) collates these annual student statistics from data provided by all medical schools across Australia and New Zealand. The collected statistics are stored and managed by Medical Deans, and provides a national source of comprehensive trans-Tasman medical school student and graduate data.

These student statistics are used by Medical Deans to provide our members with collated snapshot and trend information regarding enrolments, commencements, graduates, international, and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander and Māori student numbers.

The data collected each year is published on the Medical Deans website, and is also provided to the Australian Department of Health for the Medical Education and Training (MET) dataset.
